

#### "Family First" in Many Ways

**Family** as the first and best choice for children Services to reduce risk and prevent removal from home

...as a safety net when children cannot remain at home Emphasis on kinship placement and kinship navigation

...as a high quality foster care service Improved foster care standards

...as the first and best choice for children in foster care Reduction in payments for congregate settings

## Federal Funding for Evidence-Based Prevention Services







In-home parent skill-building and development

Substance abuse treatment and prevention Mental health treatment



#### Prevention Opportunities

- ✓ **Transform** the child welfare focus from foster care to prevention, increased family stability, and well-being
- ✓ **Invest** in evidence-based interventions
- ✓ **Apply** a trauma-responsive lens to the continuum of prevention services
- ✓ Partner across systems to align prevention efforts
- ✓ **Scale** up prevention services and de-scale foster care





## Reduce Inappropriate Institutional Placements

- Family First restricts federal dollars for institutional placements
- Federal reimbursement primarily available for:
  - ✓ Facilities that meet the *Qualified Residential Treatment Program* (QRTP) criteria
  - ✓ Children whose assessment indicates their clinical needs are best met in a residential treatment setting





#### Create Responsive Placement Arrays

- ✓ Improve quality of treatment settings to better address child needs
- ✓ **Build** an effective array of family-based placements and community supports to meet treatment needs and promote placement stability
- ✓ **Prevent** inappropriate increases to the juvenile justice population and inappropriate clinical diagnoses
- ✓ Provide aftercare services to promote on-going stability and success
- ✓ Expand business models of placement providers beyond group care
- ✓ **Scale** up high quality foster caregiving and descale group care settings

#### Prevention Plans: Key Elements

- Eligibility and Candidacy Identification
- Services Description and Oversight
- Child Specific Prevention Plan
- Monitoring Child Safety
- Evaluation and Continuous Quality Improvement
- Child Welfare Workforce Training and Support
- Prevention Caseloads for Child Welfare Workers
- Efforts to Consult and Coordinate with Key Stakeholders/Partners


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

#### Candidacy of Care Definition

- A child(ren) or youth residing with a parent or caregiver who DCF determines is at imminent risk of foster care and out of home placement
- A child(ren) or youth who exited foster care to adoption or permanent custodianship or guardianship, or who was reunified with parents and is at risk of entering foster care.
- Pregnant and parenting youth in foster care and out of home placement.
- Siblings residing in the home of youth in foster care.




